

Average answer of 4.68 from all respondents










Please rate the audio visual at the conference



Please rate the conference theming/signage





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Please rate the icebreaker/welcome function








- I didn't get the emails initially but Glenda did get hold of me directly and let me know I had prepaid my ticket from 2021 tbh I had forgotten!

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Please rate Trafinz 2023 for overall experience 1 = Poor, 5 = Excellent



If no, please explain

- Felt more relevant to councils than consultants.
- Not really because we work in behaviour change and the majority of the talks were on all the other elements of the safe system. It would be good to have more best practice examples of how a campaign or education programme led to positive outcomes. The research needs to be robust though not just a survey. I was disappointed to see the Trauma Hospital get a slot to speak and promote a programme that does not meet best practice - I felt this gave it a legitimacy that is not deserved.





Are there any speakers you would like to see next time?

- Anything road safety related. Loved the bike hub talk and the creativity of the talk about the bike lane across the harbour bridge in Auckland
- Definitely get that Richard Young and Fiain back again for a storytime update on the Auckland Harbour Bridge

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What improvements could be made?

 - Better MC
- Consider combining conference with EngNZ Transportation Group conference as they are similar
- Day 2 and 3 interactive sessions or the workshops every 2nd or 3rd as it gets quite long sitting (even though the presentations are great)Quite urban focused presentations, would be good to inject some rural.
 - Events App needed to include presentation Titles, Names and Abstracts as in the pdf version.
 - Have a few more consultants attend.
 - I thought there could have been more technical papers.



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What improvements could be made?

- If possible a workshop for Politicians at local government and national level
- More road safety initiatives related guest speakers to attract road safety coordinators to attend.
- Needed more delegates and more streams of presentations, options to choose from, more top calibre presenters
 - Overall, it was really well run
 - Probably condense down to two days not three.
- Provision of bike racks inside was great and should be the standard at every other venue. Would like to have tables at lunch instead of standing room
- Running from Tuesday to Thursday preferred to finishing on a Friday afternoon, and trying to avoid proximity to similar events in Australasia
- Signage to help people know where to go for things it was unclear where to go at first and which room was which (they were not clearly labelled with the room names). This is especially true for the welcoming function, which was quite hard to find! More gluten free options in the catering (it was pretty good, but more options would be great). Gluten free options clearly labelled (sometimes they forgot to label things)

What improvements could be made?

• The catering during the day was average. The morning session only had tea and coffee (I drink neither). I had to ask for water / juice. Breakfast Pastries etc would have been nice. In general, a wider selection of food and drink would be great

- The numbers in the workshop sessions. I get overall numbers were probably not that high, but they
 weren't very well attended as ran concurrent to the field trips. It was a real shame that there was an
 event neighbouring the dinner, you couldn't really hear Andy on the microphone. The cost of
 additional tickets is quite high.
 - The venue audio system had a high-pitched buzz in the exhibition space which became a little annoying at times. The lighting in the space was also quite dark.
- There is inevitably some variability in the quality of presentations. I would like a venue with windows to the outside world.



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


